

From Father's Desk

So Why Does Terror Happen? From Crux:

ROME - On Easter Monday, Pope Francis led thousands of people in St. Peter's Square in praying for the hundreds of people who died or were injured in bomb blasts the previous day in Sri Lanka. Pope Francis had already condemned the bombings and offered prayers April 21 after celebrating Easter morning Mass. The next day, after Sri Lankan officials reported 290 confirmed deaths from the eight blasts at churches and hotels in three cities, the pope told the crowd gathered in St. Peter's Square for the Regina Coeli prayer, "I want to again express my spiritual and paternal closeness to the people of Sri Lanka." "I pray for the numerous victims and injured," he said, "and I ask everyone not to hesitate to offer this dear nation all the necessary help. I also hope that everyone will condemn these terrorist acts, inhuman acts, that are never iustifiable."

This week we heard that the Sri Lankan government has blamed the local Islamist group National Thowheed Jamath (NTJ) for the suicide bombings that hit three churches and three luxury hotels packed with tourists. This is a sad reminder that acts of terror and violence are still all too common in our world. Many of us ask, "Why do these things happen?" In a world controlled by a kind, loving God, shouldn't these acts be impossible? In turn, then, some even conclude that God must not exist!

The truth is that God does exist, and he does love us very much. However, like any good parent, he gives us free will. He does not want to control our lives, but instead to seek him freely and choose for ourselves a better path. In such a world, there will always be those who choose the wrong path and commit these terrible acts of violence. Those who commit these acts usually believe that they are doing so in the promotion of a greater good. Perhaps they believe this will lead to some sort of holy war where only the righteous will survive. Perhaps they believe that this will lead to a political revolution that will tear down the old, corrupt order. Some, dedicated to evil itself, only want to cause more suffering.

Christians must respond to these barbaric acts in a way that does not perpetuate a cycle of destruction. The guilty should be caught, punished, and tried according to the law. Others who might seek to commit similar acts should be found and converted to a better way of thinking. Revenge, reprisal, and warfare might make us feel good in the short term, but is unlikely to achieve a lasting peace. We are not confronting a stable nation state or ideal (as we did in WW2) but instead a whole host of ideas, stateless men. and those whose only goal is destruction. As a result, our tactics must change to reflect these difficult times.
