

From Fr. Patrick

"Mercy", for many years this was a word reserved for wrestling matches with my brothers when we couldn't take any more. Over the years I have come to realize that this is not simply a word used to avert violence but a word that is synonymous with Love. Many years ago when I was coming back to my faith I was encouraged to seek out God's love through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I have to admit that I really didn't think of love when I thought of Reconciliation. I thought of humiliation, fear, guilt, and shame way before love entered by mind. I can't even say that after returning to the sacrament after many years of being away from it I immediately came to know God's Love through this sacrament. It was over time that I was able to truly receive God's love through this Sacrament of Mercy.

"Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." In our Gospel for Divine Mercy Sunday or the 1st Sunday of Easter we hear this command from Christ. This is the first encounter that the Apostles had with Christ and He immediately commissions them to forgive sins, the first real commission of Christ after His death to His Apostles, must be important.

Since the very beginning of Christ's ministry we hear of His love. However, Mercy is not always expressed explicitly as its equal. Yet, with this command it is made quite clear that Mercy, Christ's loving response to our sin, is very much His mission. This mission becomes Christ's primary goal following His death, first by showing it to His unfaithful Apostles, then to the rest of His followers, Christ is establishing the primary ministry of His Body, the Church, after His death and resurrection. Thus, Christ's ministry of mercy is necessarily carried out by His followers, His disciples.

The church mandates that all who are practicing their faith must go to confession once a year. This rule is not simply a hoop to be jumped through it is an invitation to encourage Christ's mercy, His loving response to our sin. This necessary step in embracing His mission of love is marked by an encounter with and deeper knowledge of how much He loves us despite our failure to love Him in return. The more we come to encounter this love so vividly revealed through confession the more we can than share it with others. I realize that there are many concerns about going to confession but whether or not Christ wanted confession is undeniable. We hear in our Gospel a clear command to do so by the ministers of the early Church. Thus, this formal manifestation of this commandment must not be ignored. It is through this encounter with mercy that we then are called to love in response to sin.

This weekend which Saint Pope John Paul II promulgated as Divine Mercy Sunday, is where we reflect on this message of mercy that was shared with a humble nun in Poland, St. Faustina. His words, documented in a book titled *Divine Mercy in My Soul* Christ speaks profoundly of the need for Mercy not only from Jesus but from us as well. I strongly encourage all to attend the Divine Mercy service this Sunday at 3PM at St. Peter's in Eagle River. There will be ample opportunity to go to confession.

WHY WE DO WHAT WE DO

Q. On Easter Sunday we were invited to sing the Sequence. What is a Sequence and why do we sing it?

A. A Sequence is an ancient musical form used several times on specific Solemnities and Feasts during the Church year. Easter and Pentecost have required Sequences. while it is optional on Corpus Christi and Our Lady of Sorrows. The Sequence derives from the Latin word *sequi*, which means "follows," as it historically followed the Alleluia. Currently it comes just before the Alleluia.

The Easter Sequence, known as Victimae paschali laudes in Latin, (Christians, to the Paschal Victim

offer sacrifice and praise) is a beautiful and ancient poem, telling a short narrative story of Resurrection morn, set to a wonderful Gregorian chant melody.


