

From Fr. Patrick

Not more than a couple weeks after I began my first assignment as a priest at St. Patrick in Hudson, Wisconsin, my pastor went on vacation. This meant that I was in charge. His only expectations, "Don't burn the church down." I was not quite concerned about the church bursting into flames but I have to admit I didn't feel quite adequate. It got worse when after Mass I was locked out of the church and my car, which prompted a concerned neighbor to call the police because "some guy dressed in black was trying to break into a car in the church parking lot." The next morning I arrived at church with alarms blaring and I assumed that the church was actually burning down. To my relief I had tripped some alarm when I was trying to "break" into church. Needless to say I wasn't feeling up to task of running a parish when my pastor returned. I remember very vividly the conversation we had. He asked me how the weekend went and I informed him of all that happened. He then asked me if I loved the people this weekend. I realized that the weekend wasn't that much of a disaster after it was all put into perspective.

This weekend we continue to visit the rekindling of a relationship between Christ and His Apostles. The one who takes center stage in our Gospel for this the third Sunday in Easter is St. Peter, who has been in and out of this story leading up to and following Christ 's passion, death and resurrection. This encounter marks a pinnacle moment in Christ's mission and identity for Peter who has been challenged by the Lord throughout the whole of the Gospels. What stands as a challenge to us all is that fact that Peter is invited not once but three times to not only love Christ but to feed His sheep. Three times Peter must turn from His denial of Christ to an acceptance of Him, both in accepting His love and responding to it.

Throughout Lent there seems to be a strong focus of recognizing the many ways we deny Christ and His identity but in turn we find ourselves sometimes denying our own identity as well. This common struggle of not knowing who we are and whose we are and doing something about it often comes from a feeling of inadequacy. When faced with our past failures we tend to doubt our ability live up to Christ. What is most profound about Christ's questions to Peter is something the translation misses. Peter is asked if He loves Jesus (Agape love) which is a total self-giving love. Peter responds the first two times he is asked that he loves Jesus (Filial love) which is more likened to familial or brotherly love. The third time Jesus asks Peter if he loves Jesus with Filial love and it is here that Jesus calls Peter out from his place of self pity and loathing to the position of first pope and martyr.

Easter remains always a time to claim our identity in Christ. Every Sunday we celebrate a sprinkling rite that emphasizes our baptism. Again and again throughout Easter we are called to remember who we are and what we were claimed to be. We must never forget our baptism. For this reason I am grateful for the chance to have baptisms during mass. With this said I would simply like to address those who struggle with the time commitment it takes to have a Mass with a baptism. I would simply invite those with this struggle to again revisit what is more important, an opportunity to witness the claiming of one soul for Christ, an act that changes that person's life forever or whatever plans most people feel they need to rush off to that tends to distract us from our own identities in the first place.

WHY WE DO WHAT WE DO

Q. I have a friend out east who insists that the Ascension is celebrated on a Thursday. I know that we've celebrated it on a Sunday. Who's correct?

A. Actually, you're both right, with an "it depends" attached. Your friend out east likely celebrates Ascension on the 40th day after Easter, which is always a Thursday. This has a scriptural basis in the Acts of the Apostles, "He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God." (Acts 1:3) About 20% of the dioceses in the US celebrate it this way, all in the northeast, except for the dioceses in Nebraska. The other 80% of dioceses have transferred the solemnity to what used to be the 7th Sunday of Easter. Doing this allowed greater exposure and more solemn celebration of the holy day among the faithful in the face of declining attendance in the middle of the week. Epiphany and Corpus Christi are other holy days which have been transferred to Sundays.


