Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

As darkness was settling on the "City of Lights," this past Monday night, April 15th, in Paris, France, it was particularly dark that night, for there was both spiritual smoke and a dark cloud of emotional sadness in the air. For the great Christian and Catholic landmark, the Cathedral of Notre Dame "Our Lady" (named after the Blessed Mother of God) was consumed by fire on this Monday of Holy Week, just after the great feast of Palm Sunday. Anyone who loves historic churches as I do, it was a proverbial "punch in the stomach"; even though many of us have never seen this great architectural wonder. (*Personally, seeing the Cathedral of Notre Dame was on my bucket list in the next decade.)

The Cathedral of Notre Dame had its first beginnings as far back as 1163, some 800 years ago. When the cornerstone was laid, Pope Alexander III, was in attendance. The church is believed to have been one of the best examples of French-Gothic architecture in the world. It is estimated that some 30,000 pilgrims and visitors came to see this church every day. The roof line alone that burned is estimated to be 330-feet-long! The interior of the sanctuary and nave was filled with precious art works of oil, plaster and stone. It is uncertain how much of this artwork can be saved, if anything at all.

While it is presumed at this time that the start of this landmark fire was due to some extensive construction and/or restoration of the worship space; it is worth noting that numerous Catholic churches in recent months have been vandalized or damaged in France this year in 2019. For in March of 2019, in just one week, 12 churches across France were vandalized due to anti-Catholic and anti-Christian sentiment. Questions are being raised at this time as to how a possible construction fire could spread so quickly and so fiercely in such a short span of time.

Well, regardless if the fire was the result of natural causes or human intervention, it is a monumental tragedy. This fire in many respects could be compared to the United State's 9-11. For equally, the Twin Towers in New York, that appeared almost like two cathedral spires on the Manhattan sky-line, also came crashing down, along with the loss of some 3,000 souls. (*It appears that there was no loss of human life due to this fire in France.) German Chancellor Angela Merkel, and British Prime Minister Theresa May, stated that the Cathedral of Notre Dame was a "symbol of France and our European culture."

While what these women said is true, FIRST and FOREMOST, the Cathedral of Notre Dame was a church dedicated to "Our Lady," the Blessed Mother, who bore Christ in her womb. Christ was born in Mary's "womb," so that He could come forth from the "tomb" on that first Easter morning and overcome the darkness of death and sin (and yes, even the fires of hell), to save us and allow us to share in eternal salvation.

When I saw the church burning after I returned from my morning funeral and turned on the television, I was hearing the reporters using the words "unprecedented," "unexpected," and "unimaginable." I watched with sadness this fierce physical fire in France, and immediately thought to myself that "perhaps" the origin of this historic fire is less the result of "natural forces" but instead more the result of "supernatural forces." For the adage still holds that God works in mysterious ways. I spoke to a large number of you in our Lenten Pastoral sessions that when it comes to the Church's teachings, there are two after-life existences where fires are burning according to Church teaching and tradition. Both our Lord and St. Paul make mention of these realities in the scriptures.

There was a time when France was called the "First Daughter of the Church," because the faith was so strong in this large European country. Some of the greatest saints of the Church came from the country of France. Some of these saints include: St. Therese of Lisieux, St. John Vianney, St. Bernadette of Lourdes, St. Vincent de Paul, St. Joan of Arc, and St. Catherine Laboure, to name just a few of these great and holy figures. But in only the past fifty years, the Church in France, much less the Catholic Church across Europe has fallen on some very hard spiritual times. Less than 10% of French Catholics go to Mass on Sunday. That means that 90%, the overwhelming majority, are merely cultural Catholics. The image of the Church in France that comes to my mind are the words from the Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen. "They are like an empty perfume bottle that all that is left is the smell."



On this Easter, the Good News is that death and destruction is not the last word. Christ rose from the dead. If we can build great sports facilities in remote metropolitan places like Minnesota, than certainly this great Cathedral to the Blessed Mother in France, can be rebuilt to honor her Son through the sacraments weekly. May we who are passing guests on this earth have on our lips the Prayer of Fatima, prayed during each rosary: "Oh my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to heaven, especially those who are most in need of thy mercy." Happy Easter!




