## Second Sunday of Lent March 17, 2019

Greetings,

"While he was praying his face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white."

Sometimes we take for granted the power of prayer. Why does prayer seem to be so difficult? Many of us hope for some sort of change when we pray. Jesus shows us how transformative true union with the Father through prayer can be.

The main obstacle to effective prayer is preparation. How so? Do we prepare for prayer like a general preparing his army for battle? If this sounds strange consider these words on prayer from the Catechism which I have taken from the section on Christian prayer:

"Prayer is both a gift of grace and a determined response on our part. It always presupposed effort. The great figures of prayer of the Old Covenant before Christ, as well as the Mother of God, the saints, and he himself, all teach us this: prayer is a battle. Against whom? Against ourselves and against the wiles of the tempter who does all he can to turn man away from prayer, away from union with God. We pray as we live, because we live as we pray. If we do not want to act habitually according to the spirit of Christ, neither can we pray habitually in his name. The "spiritual battle" of the Christians new life us inseparable from the battle of prayer." (2725)

During this time of Lent we are called to focus our attention on prayer, fasting and almsgiving, these three pillars of Lent are meant to prepare our hearts for the Resurrection. Let us recommit ourselves to putting forth a greater "presupposed effort" to strengthening our conversation with our Lord through prayer!
